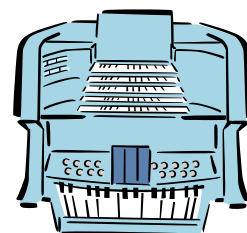

Dawn Bradley Filler received a Bachelor of Music Degree in Organ Performance/Sacred Music from Duquesne University in Pittsburgh, PA where she studied with John Walker, Ann Labounsky, and David Craighead. While in Pittsburgh she was a two-time Chapter winner of the Young Organist Competition sponsored by the American Guild of Organists and earned the Colleague Certificate through the Guild. She received a Master of Music Degree in Organ Performance, studying under Barbara MacGregor, at the University of Akron.

Dawn is currently Director of Music and Organist for the First United Methodist Church of Akron where she directs the adult vocal, handbell, and occasional instrumental choirs. Her focus at the church, however, is offering music education to children through church programming. Her children's handbell and vocal choirs perform regularly for church services, perform for the community, and participate in many music festivals.

Dawn is currently Dean, and member of the Akron Chapter of the American Guild of Organists. She is a member of the Chorister's Guild, American Guild of English Handbell Ringers, and Brahms Allegro Teachers' Club. Dawn is a performing member of the Summit Bells, a semi-professional handbell ensemble that has performed with the Ashland Symphony, the Brass Band of the Western Reserve, and at Severance Hall before the Cleveland Orchestra Christmas Concerts, as well as for many local activities.
