RECYCLING

Christmas shopping is well underway. Many of us are now doing our shopping online and most every package delivered comes in a cardboard box. Before you put that box out to be picked up with the trash, please consider the following information.

- Recycling cardboard only takes 75% of the energy needed to make new cardboard.
- Recycling I ton of cardboard saves 46 gallons of oil.
- Over 90% of all products shipped in the US are shipped in corrugated boxes, which totals more than 400 billion square feet of cardboard.

So when packages arrive at your house, please break down the boxes and recycle them. And please take the plastic bubble wrap, packing pellets, etc. used inside the box with you because it can also be recycled.

There will be no "Soup to Go" in December. 2015 Soup Dates are January 25 (Vegetable), February 22 (Turkey), and March 22 (Corn Chowder). Please return your "Soup to Go" glass jars and lids to the church kitchen so they can be used again.
