MY Habitat for Humanity®

In February, *Mickey Buck* will be traveling to Honolulu, Hawaii to participate in a **Habitat for Humanity Global Village Build**. Mickey is paying for her own flight, but can accept donations to cover lodging, transportation and meals in Hawaii. In addition, a portion of the money raised will go toward the building of the Habitat home.

Homelessness in Hawaii remains a reality for a considerable number of individuals and families. The number of homeless has been increasing at a rate of 6% per year. The median house price in parts of Hawaii is \$275,000, which is not affordable to most of the local workforce. In the most rural areas, almost 20% of the dwellings listed by the Community Development Corporation consist of tents, yurts, lava tubes, and cargo containers.

You can donate directly to Mickey, or you can donate through the Church and your gift will be properly channeled to her. A gift of whatever size will let Mickey know that her church family is "with her" on this very worthwhile adventure.

Per Capita is an assessment paid to General Assembly, Synod, and Presbytery for each member of the congregation. Per Capita funding is how Presbyterians mutually share the costs of coming together to discern the Spirit's leading for the future. It is how Presbyterians are trained to become better elders and ministers. It is how Presbyterians discern God's call in their lives. The Per Capita Apportionment due for the year 2017 for First Presbyterian Church in Salem is based upon reported active membership at the end of the year 2015, which was 311. The amount for each active member is \$32.00.
