## March 7 — The Third Sunday in Lent

Sermon: *The Question "Why"*  
Scripture: Isaiah 55:1-9; Psalm 63:1-8; Luke 13:1-9  
Music: Haviland Choir

Dear Friends,

We have now entered the season of Lent, which gives us 40 days to reflect on what it means to live as Jesus' disciples. Over the centuries, many Christians have found that it is helpful to simplify one's life in some way during Lent – by fasting, by "giving something up," by cutting back on some expenditures in order to give more generously to the needs of our neighbors.

While we might not think of moving our household as a spiritual exercise, getting ready to move to Salem over the last two months has been cause for a fair amount of reflection. While we are moving a *lot* of "stuff," I am so pleased to have thrown out dozens of bags of trash, given a number of bags of serviceable clothing to the Way Station, and filled my church office with donations to the LOGOS Rummage Sale.

But what's important isn't what we've gotten rid of, but what we've kept: architectural plans drawn by my late father-in-law; items crafted of wood by my own late father; things that belonged to our mothers; remembrances of Rachel and David's childhoods and adolescence; furnishings that each of us grew up with. (Steve and I have already moved about 300 boxes... and the movers haven't arrived yet!)

Maybe the cherishing of "things" doesn't sound very spiritual. But the *Directory for Worship* of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) reminds us:

In Jesus' ministry, he used *common things* like nets, fish, baskets, jars, ointment, clay, towel and basin, water, bread, and wine. Working in and through these material things, he blessed and healed people, reconciled and bound them into community, and exhibited the grace, power, and presence of the Kingdom of God.

Jesus used "common things" to point to God's love. This Lent, God may very well use the joint services we'll be sharing each Wednesday with Salem Lutherans and Episcopalians. At each service, we will use the "material things" of bread and cup to be nurtured and strengthened by God's presence with us. I hope you will consider being part of these worship experiences.

This week I hope to move and to attend a meeting of the General Assembly Permanent Judicial Commission. I want to extend sincere thanks to the Rev. Ross Jackson, who will be preaching *gratis* next Sunday so that I might do this work for our denomination.
