Dear Friends,



Over the past two years a group has been working to preserve many of the Church's paper records in a digital format. The Day-timer's program for February 2 offers a view of First Presbyterian Church, Salem during the 1970s based on part of this archival record. To make more of this record available, some information from this database will be reproduced occasionally in *The Presbyterian Messenger*.

From the Messenger, January 7, 1940:

PASTORAL CALLS

From Sept. 1st to Dec. 31st, the pastor has made 378 calls. He continues into the New Year, with the hopes of reaching all the homes before Easter. It is a sizable job and is in addition to the frequent calls on the sick and prospective members.

WHAT SHALL I GIVE?

Our financial secretary has estimated that it cost us \$13.14 annually per member to run our church. This includes both current and benevolence budgets. When you try to figure what you should give each year to the church, bear this in mind. Naturally many of the youth members and any unemployed cannot give \$13.14 each, so that others must give much more. The Scriptural standard is that we are to give according as God has prospered us. The church recommends that for each dollar given it be divided thus: 75 cents for current expenses and 25 cents for benevolence budget.

Cookbook Corrections

p. 67 — Crock Pot Macaroni and Cheese (Wavelene Arnold)
Include 2 eggs — beaten

p. 172 — Date Pudding Cake (Teri Lou Pike)
Lemon Sauce:

Blend sugar, flour and salt in a pan. Add boiling water to the mixture and stir until smooth. Boil for 3 minutes. Add butter and stir until completely melted. Add the lemon juice. Pour over the date pudding cake. Yield for cake and sauce, 12-16 pieces.

p. 174 — Wassail (Meta Cramer)

½ C. brown sugar

2 tsp. cloves

dash ginger and/or nutmeg

Bring to boil, then simmer 5 minutes to an hour.

Optional: Floating Cloud Oranges — put whole cloves ½" apart in oranges. Bake, uncovered, at 325 with water in bottom of pan. Cover and refrigerate.
