### **Back-to-School Voucher Sign-Ups**

Come to Emmanuel Lutheran Church's Education Building and bring proof of residency in Salem (drivers' license, utility bills) and bring your children's birth certificate or other proof of their existence and their age (s) at the following times:

- Wednesday, July 22 from 9 to Noon and I-3 p.m.
- Thursday, July 23 from 9 to Noon and 1-3 p.m.
- Friday, July 24 from 9 to Noon and 3-6 p.m.
- Thursday, July 30 from 3-6 p.m.

Vouchers may be redeemed at Salem Walmart only, and must be redeemed no later than August 31, 2015. You must bring the children you are purchasing for to the store with you, and vouchers may only be used for the purchase of clothing, coats, and shoes for school.

Limited Deacon Scholarship Funds are available for students from our church who are enrolled in College or University and who have not previously received Deacon assistance. #### **RECYCLING NEWS**

The following information is taken from an article in **The Green Scene** (an email publication of the Mahoning County Solid Waste District.)



Tips for Reducing Styrofoam:

- 1. Use a travel mug for coffee at fast food restaurants.
- 2. Buy produce loose rather than in Styrofoam trays.
- 3. Ask for aluminum foil or take your own container with you for restaurant food.
- 4. Use dry popcorn instead of Styrofoam peanuts for packaging materials. If you receive Styrofoam peanuts, return them to UPS and Fed-Ex shippers. The peanuts will be reused.

#### What Can & Cannot Be Recycled

- Styrofoam plates and cups cannot be recycled. Paper plates that are greasy and very messy cannot be recycled. Plates that can easily have crumbs, etc. brushed off with little debris remaining can be recycled.
- K-Cups and individual Coffee Creamers cannot be recycled.
- Small Plastic caps on bottles cannot be recycled, but the larger ones can.
- All metal cans and foil can be recycled.
- Paper cartons from milk, juice, broths can be recycled.
- All glass containers can be recycled.
- All plastic containers with numbers can be recycled.
   At this time, other plastic cannot be recycled.
- Cardboard boxes can be recycled and should be broken down before being placed in recycle bins.
- Plastic Bags cannot be recycled at Kimble, but should be dropped off at grocery stores where they have specially marked recycle bins for bags.
- All paper can be recycled anything that can be torn.
  Construction paper takes more processing but can be recycled. Shredded paper contaminates the glass. It is suggested that a sheet of paper be torn into 2-4 pieces and put in with other recyclable papers.
- How clean do items need to be? Rinsed, but not necessarily scrubbed. No used/dirty napkins, tissues, or paper towels. Throw away the bottom of pizza boxes if they are messy/greasy but recycle the top portion.
- Aerosol cans can be recycled.
- Toothpaste tubes should be thrown in the trash along with pumps from soap dispensers, and plastic eating utensils.
