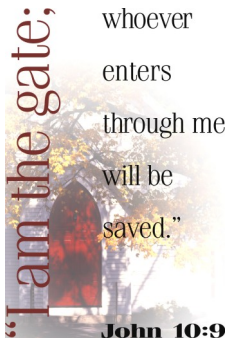

Dear Friends,

On Tuesday, May 10, First Presbyterian Church will be hosting the meeting of Eastminster Presbytery, beginning at 5 p.m. People will be coming from east and west, from north and south, to gather in our sanctuary. As you know, the Presbyterian system of church government is based on *connections*. We are well aware that this congregation does not represent the totality of the Church of Jesus Christ. Neither, for that matter, does the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.). But the Presbyterian way of doing things gives us broader wisdom, regular support, and a means of accountability as we carry out the ministry and mission of Jesus in the world.

A Presbytery meeting should be attended by all Ministers of Word and Sacrament who are members of that Presbytery and by a commissioner elected by the Session of each church within the Presbytery. Elder John Stoffer will be our commissioner to the May meeting, but *you are welcome to attend all or part of the meeting as a guest*. The Haviland Choir will be participating in the worship service, which will take place at, or shortly before, 6 p.m. Our banners, made in the 1980's, that represent the creeds and confessions of the church, will also be taken out of storage and used during worship.

Many volunteers are needed to offer hospitality to the Presbytery and many of you have already stepped forward to help. If you would still like to get involved, please call the church office and you will be steered in the right direction! THANKS in advance to all who are helping with this important event!
