From the Messenger, November 23, 1941:

The Elders and Trustees have asked that all persons or organizations wishing to use the Church clear through Miss Cook. This is the only way we can avoid conflicts in dates. The session has specified that no meetings of any nature be scheduled for Wednesday and Thursday evenings. Wednesday evening is the mid-week service of the Church. Thursday evening is reserved for the Choir.

This is your part in boosting our little Church paper. What would Presbyterians do without the Messenger? It keeps our Church family together.
