Dear Friends,

At our opening prayer time before children's Sunday School this week, I was impressed that every adult there offered praise to God for the beauty of the fall weather. This happened despite the fact that Sunday morning featured a rather dismal sky and no promise of much warmth! I was reminded of the words of the prophet Habakkuk:

Though the fig tree does not blossom, and no fruit is on the vines;

though the produce of the olive fails, and the fields yield no food;

though the flock is cut off from the fold, and there is no herd in the stalls,

yet I will rejoice in the LORD; I will exult in the God of my salvation.

Habakkuk isn't describing a merely cloudy day; he is talking about real hunger and need. And yet, and yet, he rejoices in the LORD's promises and providence.

It is usual, during the month of November, to turn our thoughts to gratitude and thanksgiving. However, even before November arrives, we have a special opportunity to give thanks to God on October 30. On the Sunday nearest November I (All Saints Day), we have been remembering those saints of this congregation who have joined the Church Triumphant in the past year. I am especially glad that we are sharing the Lord's Supper on this day, for we do believe that at the Lord's Table we are "united in communion with all the faithful in heaven and on earth" {"The Directory for Worship," part of the Constitution of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.)}. Unfortunately, I need to be at the last meeting of the General Assembly Permanent Judicial Commission on October 30, but the Rev. Richard Ferris will capably lead our worship that Sunday. It can be a bittersweet experience to give thanks to God for lives that have touched ours; "yet we will rejoice in the LORD; we will exult in the God of our salvation."

Our Church History ...

From the Messenger, October 19, 1961:

HOW DO WE RATE?

The October 15 issue of "Presbyterian Life" contains a number of statistics and a mass of informative material on the whole life of the United Presbyterian Church. This information is essential to the broad understanding required of Presbyterians as they are charged with individual responsibility for decision about the great task of the Church both in local communities and across the world.

We as United Presbyterians have been called into the Christian Church with the responsibility of going into all the world for Jesus Christ. Our General Assembly long years ago described our Church as a "missionary society".

To endeavor to do this on the "leavings" from the incomes of individuals or from "what is left over" in the budget of a church after we do all we want to do for ourselves, is to fail utterly in our Mission in the world. Yet this is the way many members, and many churches, have endeavored to serve Jesus Christ.

Our denomination, composed generally of middle-class Americans, ranks 20th in giving per member, following many denominations composed of members in lower income brackets.

Within our denomination, among 400 churches with membership between 1,000 and 1,500 members, our church ranks as follows:

125th in membership

198th in giving to local expenses of the congregation 205th in total giving

28th in giving Per Capita to the General Mission (benevolences; although, even in such rank, we contribute but $I \not\in$ per member per day to missionary efforts overseas)

Our giving per member is approximately 15% below the average of churches of our size group and about 10% below the average of all churches in the denomination.
