# **Recycling Notes**

Here are some suggestions I presented at Denise's Big Backyard on ways to that we can reduce the amount of waste that we produce. I encourage you to make every effort to try to find some that you can incorporate in your daily life.



- PLEASE use reusable water bottles instead of buying bottled water.
- Get yourself a nice reusable coffee mug rather than taking foam cups at the coffee shops.
- When shopping for produce, don't take plastic bags for single items i.e. cucumbers, avocados, peppers etc.
- When shopping, if you are only getting I or 2 items, tell the clerk you don't need a bag.
- When eating out, take your own container from home for your leftovers. And instead of taking a Styrofoam container, ask to have a piece of foil for your sandwich, pizza slice etc.
- When entertaining, use real glasses and dishes rather than plastic or paper.
- Maybe you could use real table cloths rather than the cheap plastic throwaway ones.
- Don't throw away those yogurt, sour cream, cottage cheese containers. They are great to use for leftovers and then you don't need to use plastic wrap.
   Even jelly jars, pickle jars, or even canning jars are great for leftovers in the fridge. (And they are better for you than the plastic.)
- Don't throw away spiral notebooks if there are still pages left in them. Even a few pages are good for shopping lists or to do lists.
- If you are a K-Cup user, buy a reusable pod.
- Cut down on the amount of junk mail you get and reduce waste of paper by sending a letter requesting that you be taken off the distribution list (address below).
